- Please Note:**
1. TAFE NSW does not accept evidence from English language tests where an entire test is delivered online (also known as “remote-proctored” or “at-home”). Examples of online tests that are not accepted, include: IELTS Online, LANGUAGECERT Academic Online, OET@Home, CELPIP Online, MET Digital (taken at-home), TOEFL iBT – Home Edition etc.
 2. If you do not meet the English competency requirements, you can choose to study an [English Course](#) at a TAFE NSW English Language Centre before you start your course.
 3. Depending on your nationality, the Australian Department of Home Affairs (DoHA) might accept only approved English test result as proof of English competency for student visa purposes. Go to the [Department of Home Affairs](#) website for details.
 4. If you have completed your studies in Australia (or other Countries listed above) more than 2 years ago then you must explain the gap with relevant studies in an English speaking environment (or) work experience in an English speaking country (or) provide an acceptable alternative to meet English proficiency. Please note that the Department of Home Affairs might still require you to take an approved English test at the time of visa application.
 5. If you are using Australian study to meet English entry requirement to study at TAFE NSW, you must provide evidence of one of the following:
 - Completion of Senior Secondary Certificate of Education in Australia
 - Completion of AQF Certificate IV in Australia
 - Completion of minimum one semester in higher AQF qualifications
 - Completion of Foundation Program with a pass in English in Australia
 6. You must declare on the TAFE NSW application form in section 4 that English is your primary language.
 7. You must show evidence of continuous education with no gap (except institution’s scheduled holidays) as at the time of submitting an application for Diploma of Nursing course. If there is a gap you will be required to provide a valid English Language test result.
 8. You must meet the English language requirements as per AHPRA Registration Standard for Nursing and Midwifery at the time of application for Diploma of Nursing course.
 9. TOEFL iBT tests that were completed between 26 July 2023 and 4 May 2024 will not be accepted for Australian visa and migration purposes. During this period, the TOEFL iBT test being offered was not an approved test.
 10. From 12 February 2024 to 6 August 2025, only results from the paper-based Cambridge C1 Advanced test (previously known as Cambridge English: Advanced CAE) will be accepted for Australian visa and migration purposes. Test scores for both C1 Advanced paper-based and computer-based tests taken before 12 February 2024, within the specified validity period are still accepted.
 11. In Australia, the *Senior Secondary Certificate of Education* for each state is:
NSW: Higher School Certificate (HSC)
VIC: Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)
QLD: Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)
SA: South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE)
WA: Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)
TAS: Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE)
NT: Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET)
ACT: ACT Senior Secondary Certificate (ACT SSC)
